<b><u>PRIMARY PROVISION</u></b>				
<b>Abertillery Learning Community Primary Resource Base: Six Bells Campus</b>	<p>Abertillery Learning Community [ALC] Primary Specialist Resource Base is a Blaenau Gwent Local Authority maintained provision designed to host 9 children aged 5 -11years and is based at Six Bells Primary Campus. The provision is designated for children with significant delays in cognition and learning which are accompanied by one or more associated needs in other areas of learning such as delayed development of communication and interaction, delayed social, emotional and behavioural development and identified physical or sensory needs.</p> <p>The Resource Base has the advantage of high adult to pupil ratios and offers a broad and balanced curriculum with targeted specialist teaching to meet the identified additional learning needs of the pupils who attend. All learners are expected to access structured and unstructured aspects of school life offered by the attached mainstream school whenever it is appropriate for the individual child to do so. The intention is for the time spent in the mainstream classes to be periodically increased to the point where learners meet the criteria to return to their full-time mainstream provision.</p> <p>All pupils who attend the resource base are in receipt of Individual Development Plans, which are implemented in collaboration with parents/ carers and other service providers wherever applicable. Pupils' progress is reviewed regularly. The Individual Development Plan may be updated at any time following a progress review. The Individual Development Plan will be updated at least annually by holding a person-centred review. During the person-centred review continuing the placement at ALC, Six Bells specialist provision will always be reconsidered. Consideration will be given to; the child remaining at ALC, Six Bells Resource Base or accessing alternative specialist provision offered by the Local Authority, or, whenever possible, returning to full-time mainstream education. Placement is dependent on appropriate, recent, agreed multi-agency evidence [as outlined above] submitted by the referring school reflecting the strict entry criteria to the resource base.</p>
